

COOPERATIVES AND PRODUCER ORGANIZATIONS

FAO recognizes the crucial role of inclusive and efficient cooperatives and producer organizations in supporting small agricultural producers and marginalized groups such as young people and women.

They empower their members economically and socially and create sustainable rural employment through business models that are resilient to economic and environmental shocks.





SIGNIFICANCE OF AGRICULTURAL COOPERATIVES IN CREATING RESILIENT AND SUSTAINABLE SUPPLY CHAINS

Cooperatives and producer organizations provide an array of service to allow, small farmers, fisher folk, livestock keepers and forest users to be fully productive.

Such services include:

- 1. Enhancing access to and management of natural resources;
- 2. Accessing input and output markets;
- **3.** Improving access to information and knowledge;
- 4. Facilitating small producers' participation in policy-making processes.



Support in action

FAO has supported the advancement of the global agenda for cooperatives and producer :

- The International Year of Cooperatives 2012 and the International Year of Family Farming 2014, which raised awareness of cooperatives' important contribution to global socio-economic development and promoted the growth and strengthening of cooperatives all over the world;
- The partnership with Sweden's We Effect and Eataly to support small-scale forest and farm producers in various countries, such as Ethiopia, Guatemala, Kenya, Mozambique and Zambia, to improve their livelihoods, food security and resilience;
- The participation in the Chilean Family Farming week at Expo Milan 2015, which showcased the achievements and challenges of cooperatives and family farmers.


